#### **Workshop on Corporate Governance**

A workshop on 'Corporate Governance' was hosted in collaboration with the University of Glasgow on October 13, 2017. The resource persons were Dr. Iain MacNeil (Dean, School of Law, University of Glasgow, Scotland) and Dr. Irene-Marie Esser who teaches at the same institution.

### Organised a programme on Exploring Interconnections: Indian and Irish Constitutions

Centre for Constitutional Law, Policy and Good Governance Organised a programme on Exploring Interconnections: Indian and Irish Constitutions from September 11 to 18, 2017 funded by MHRD for an amount of Rs. 5.44 Lakhs. Justice John Mac was the Resource Person and the programme was attended by 130 participants.

#### **NALSAR Film Festival 2017**

4<sup>th</sup> edition of the NALSAR Film Festival was hosted by NALSAR in collaboration with Indian Bank from March 31 to April 2, 2017. The Film Festival serves as a platform for students to engage with, and have spirited discussions with the makers of socially-relevant films. The idea is to widen the interaction that law students have with the rest of society through the celebrated medium of film-making.

This year, seven films were screened over three days under the broad theme of 'Against Tradition'. The subject areas of the films included the politics surrounding caste (Deool), beef-eating practices in cities (Caste on the Menu Card), the pursuit for a place to sleep for the urban poor (Cities of Sleep) and the formation of masculine identities as influenced by Bollywood (Being Bhaijaan).

## National Conference on 'The Courts and the Constitution - 2018 in Review' on January 26 – 27, 2019

A National Conference titled 'The Courts and the Constitution – 2018 in Review' on January 26-27, 2019 was organised under the aegis of the 'Centre for Constitutional Law, Policy and Good Governance' and 'MK Nambyar SAARCLaw Centre for Advanced Legal Studies' at NALSAR in collaboration with the School of Policy and Governance, Azim Premji University, Bangalore and the editorial team of the 'Law and Other Things' Blog. This programme consisted of eight thematic sessions with a total of 24 invited speakers drawn from the judiciary, practitioners, academics and journalists. ## Workshop on 'Creating Conversations: From CSR Practice to Precept' in collaboration with Tel Aviv University (TAU), Israel from February 9-10, 2019

The Centre for Corporate Law and Taxation in collaboration with Tel Aviv University organized the workshop on 'Creating Conversations: From CSR Practice to Precept' during February 9-10, 2019. This workshop aimed to map and discuss available models of collaborations and legal and regulatory approaches towards Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) that may serve as catalyst for business to target great outcomes for people and the planet too. The workshop comprised of seven sessions and engaged some 35 presenters and participants including researchers and students, legal consultants, corporate executives responsible for MCSR execution and CSR consultants to deliberate and discuss practices and impact of corporate giving through philanthropy and MCSR in India and comparatively.

The workshop concluded with the collective understanding of the importance of continued deliberations between CSR practitioners and academia to evolve CSR as a discipline, to develop multi-disciplinary research and praxis, to create a cadre of CSR professionals and support the development of impact assessment practices. It was suggested that NALSAR establish a research center funded by CSR to facilitate multi-disciplinary engagement and research.

#### 1<sup>ST</sup> NALSAR-UNICEF IHL AND CHILD RIGHTS COMPETITION

To mark the 30<sup>th</sup> year of The Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC), NALSAR's Centre for Child and Youth Justice, in collaboration with UNCIEF, organized this competition to encourage students to deliberate on the intersection of International Humanitarian Law and Child Rights.

The oral rounds of the 1<sup>st</sup> NALSAR-UNICEF International Humanitarian Law and Child Rights Competition, 2019 were held on the April 13-14, 2019. It witnessed 15 teams participating against each other. Each team represented various roles such as Ministry of Home Affairs, UNICEF, Ministry of Defence, Office of Prime Minister etc.

The teams advanced their arguments based on the competition problem and the simulation problems which were released 45 minutes before each round. There were four preliminary rounds after which six best teams qualified for semi-finals.

After the semi-finals, the three best teams qualified for finals and competed against each other in front of a five judge bench comprising of Ms. Suroor Mander (Centre for Equity Studies), Prof. Danushka S Medawatte (Professor,

University of Colombo, Sri Lanka), Prof. Shantha Sinha (Professor, Hyderabad Central University), Ms. Ashley S Kinseth (Founder, Stateless Dignity Project) and Ms. Juhi Bansal (IHL Course Instructor, National Law University, Delhi).

## <u>'Fostering Research in Disability' - Winter School conducted by both Centre for Disability Studies and BITS - Pilani, Hyderabad campus from December16-21, 2019</u>

A Winter School on 'Fostering Research in Disability', the first of its kind in India, was jointly organized by the Centre for Disability Studies, NALSAR University of Law, Hyderabad and Department of Humanities and Social Sciences, BITS-Pilani Hyderabad Campus from December 16 to 21, 2019. Prof. Amita Dhanda (NALSAR) and Dr. Shilpaa Anand (BITS) served as Program Co-ordinators. The week-long Winter School engaged with questions of disability with a special focus on voice, representation and participation of disabled people in law-making and cultural processes. Thirty participants were selected out of the 130 applications received in June. Winter School attendees included research scholars and early to mid-career faculty members from different parts of the country and abroad, researching in the fields of Humanities, Social Sciences and Law. About fifty percent of the participants were people with disability.

Resource persons included disability scholars from the disciplines of Law, Literature, Sociology, Social Work and Anthropology. Speakers appraised participants of significant developments in the field of disability research and introduced them to topics within the field which merit research such as: a) legal and cultural disability exclusions and inclusions- legally embedded and

culturally enabled; discourses of *human rights* and *social justice*; c) 'voice' and 'representation' within disability studies scholarship. Few research programs in the country cater to researchers in disability studies while the application pool demonstrated that there is a steadily growing number of academics interested in the field. As a response to this situation, the Winter School on disability research has been proposed as an annual collaborative event between the two institutions.

Spread over two days, the conference consisted of seven substantive sessions and featured presentations by 25 invited speakers that included several legal practitioners, academics, journalists and independent researchers. The main objective was to review developments in the field of Indian Constitutional Law during the calendar year 2019. The proceedings were attended by an audience of nearly 150 participants, which included students from NALSAR, APU, SLS-Hyderabad, Osmania University and several other external visitors.

Shri. Damodar Gautam Sawang IPS, Director General of Police (DGP), Andhra Pradesh inaugurated the Three-day online Certificate Programme on "Artificial Intelligence for Smart Policing", jointly organised by NALSAR University of Law and Centre for Human Security Studies (CHSS), Hyderabad from December 1-3, 2021 at NALSAR University of Law, Hyderabad.
