ACT No. 6 OF 2010.

AN ACT FURTHER TO AMEND THE NATIONAL ACADEMY OF LEGAL STUDIES AND RESEARCH UNIVERSITY ACT. 1998.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Andhra Pradesh in the Sixty first Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

ANDHRA PRADESH GAZETTE EXTRAORDINARY IPart IV-B

Short title and commencement.

- 1. (1) This Act may be called the National Academy of Legal Studies and Research University (Amendment) Act, 2010.
- (2) It shall be deemed to have come into force on and from the 4th February, 2010.

Insertion of new section 5-A. Act 34 of 1998. In the National Academy of Legal studies and Research University Act, 1998 after section 5 the following section shall be inserted namely,-

"Reservation of seats for admission of the students into the courses. 5-A. There shall be reservation of seats in the courses in favour of Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Physically challenged persons, Women and resident students of Andhra Pradesh as

may be prescribed. However, the reservations to the resident students shall be to the candidates who passed qualifying examination in the educational institutions in the State and Common Law Admission Test (CLAT) and to the extent of twenty percent of the sanctioned intake of courses in the University.

Repeal of Ordinance 3 of 2010. The National Academy of Legal Studies and Research University (Amendment) Ordinance, 2010 is hereby repealed.

TELANGANA BILLS TELANGANA LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY

The following Bill was introduced in the Telangana Legislative Assembly on 27th September, 2021.

L. A. BILL No. 7 OF 2021.

A BILL FURTHER TO AMEND THE NATIONAL ACADEMY OF LEGAL STUDIES AND RESEARCH UNIVERSITY ACT, 1998.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Telangana in the Seventy-second Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

1. (1) This Act may be called the National Academy of Legal Studies and Research University (Amendment) Act, 2021.

Short title and commencement. (2) It shall come into force on such date as the State Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, appoint.

Substitution of section 5A. Act No. 34 of 1998.

2. In the National Academy of Legal Studies and Research University Act, 1998 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act), for section 5A, the following shall be substituted, namely,-

"5A Reservation of seats for admission of the students into the courses: There shall be reservation of seats in the courses in favour of Backward Classes, other Backward Classes, Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Physically challenged persons, Women and Resident students of Telangana, as may be prescribed:

Provided that twenty five percent (25%) of the sanctioned intake of courses in the University shall be reserved for the resident students of Telangana.

Explanation: For the purpose of this section, Resident Students of Telangana, means,-

For admission to 5 years B.A. L.L.B. (Hons.) Course :-

- (i) a student who after studying in the State of Telangana for four consecutive years appears for the qualifying examination in the Telangana State; or
- (ii) a student who has in the previous seven years resided in the State of Telangana for at least a period of four years, and completed the qualifying examination i.e. 10+2 or equivalent from the educational institutions in the State of Telangana.

For admission to L.L.M. Course :-

- (i) a student who after studying in the State of Telangana for four consecutive years appears for the qualifying examination in the Telangana State; or
- (ii) a student who has in the previous seven years resided in the State of Telangana for at least a period of

four years, and completed the qualifying examination i.e. L.L.B. from the educational institutions in the State of Telangana.".

3. In the principal Act, in section 7, for sub-section (1), the Amendfollowing shall be substituted, namely,-

ment of section 7.

- "(1) The Chief Justice of the High Court for the State of Telangana shall be the Chancellor of the University and in his absence, the acting Chief Justice of the High Court for the State of Telangana shall discharge the functions of the Chancellor.".
- 4. In the principal Act, in section 9, in sub-section (1),

Amendment of section 9.

- (i) in clause (g), for the words "Andhra Pradesh", the word "Telangana" shall be substituted;
- (ii) for clause (i), the following shall be substituted, namely,-
- "(i) two persons from amongst sitting or retired Judges of the High Court for the State of Telangana, nominated by the Chancellor;".
- 5. In the principal Act, in section 11, in sub-section (1), in clause (c), for the words "Andhra Pradesh", the word "Telangana" shall be substituted.

Amendment of section 11.

6. In the principal Act, in section 13, in sub-section (1),-

Amendment of section 13.

- (i) for clause (b), the following shall be substituted. namely .-
- "(b) One Judge from the High Court for the State of Telangana either sitting or retired nominated by the Chancellor:":
- (ii) in clause (g), for the words "Andhra Pradesh", the word "Telangana" shall be substituted.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The National Academy of Legal Studies and Research University Act was enacted in the year 1998 as Act No. 34 of 1998 and consequent on bifurcation of the State and the bifurcation of the High Court, it felt necessary to amend the said Act for substituting the words 'Andhra Pradesh' with the word 'Telangana' and for the words 'High Court for the State of Andhra Pradesh' with the words 'High Court for the State of Telangana'.

Further section 5A of the NALSAR Act, 1998 provides for reservation of seats for admission of the students into the courses and 20% of the seats are reserved for resident students of Telangana. According to the said provision, there shall be reservation of seats in the courses in favour of Schedule Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Physically challenged persons, Women and resident students of Telangana as may be prescribed.

No reservations for Backward Classes or Other Backward Classes have been provided in the Act.

However, the University have provided BC/OBC reservations in the Resident Students of Telangana quota of 20 percent of the intake. But BC/OBC reservations have not been provided in the 80% of the seats in All India Quota.

Representations have been received for providing reservations for Backward Classes or Other Backward Classes for admission of students into the courses of the University.

The Government after careful examination of the matter decided to provide reservations for Backward Classes or Other Backward Classes for admission of students into the courses of the University and also decided to enhance the quota of Resident Students of Telangana from twenty percent (20%) to twenty five percent (25%).

This bill seeks to give effect to the above decision.

Explanatory note:

The Executive Council at its meeting held on July 19, 2014 while approving the Regulations for the proposed 3-year LL.B. Degree Programme approved the increase of intake from 80 to 120 making two sections of 60 each for the 5-year B.A.,LL.B.(Hons.) programme. The Executive Council further suggested that the University should write to the Bar Council of India to obtain its approval. As per the decision of the Executive Council, we requested the Bar Council of India to inspect the NALSAR University of Law for extension of approval of affiliation. The Inspection Committee after inspecting the facilities and also the Faculty of the University, recommended for grant of affiliation by the Bar Council of India for the proposed increase in the intake.

The Bar Council of India vide letter No.BCK:D:377/3015 (LE), dated February 23, 2015 accorded extension of approval for running 5-year B.A.,LL.B.(Hons.) programme with an intake of three sections of 60 students in each section for a period of five years, i.e., from the academic year 2012-2013 to 2016-17 subject to the appointment of regular faculty to maintain the teacher student ratio. But the University at present is proposing increase of only one section as per Executive Council's earlier decision. As per the direction of the Bar Council of India, the University is taking steps for recruitment of Faculty separately before the commencement of the next academic year.

The General Council at its meeting held on March 28, 2015 considered the proposed Academic Action Plan for the year 2015 wherein the proposal for increase of intake 120 for the 5-Year B.A. LI.B. (Hons.) was reddy

In addition, as per the UGC norms, 15% seats can be allocated for Foreign Nationals. The University can allocate 18 seats for Foreign Nationals (out of 120 seats) but the increase in all the categories was made proportionately as per the existing percentage.

With regard to the 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} amendment proposed above, it is submitted that the same were reflected in the Regulations framed by the Executive Council, but to have all the rules regarding seats and conversion of vacant seats at one place, the said amendments were proposed in Statute – V.

The Hon'ble Members are requested to kindly accord their approval for implementation from the academic year 2015 – 2016.

STATUTE - V

ADMISSION PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION AGAINST 20% SEATS RESERVED FOR RESIDENT STUDENTS OF TELANGANA¹ AT NALSAR

S 5.01. In exercise of the powers under Section 10(1)(ii) of NALSAR University Act, 1998, this Statute has been framed prescribing the procedure for admission against 20% seats reserved for "resident students" of Telangana² across all categories in the courses at NALSAR provided for under Section 5A incorporated by National Academy of Legal Studies and Research University (Amendment) Act. 2010.

S 5.02. Definitions:

In this Statute, unless the context otherwise requires:

- a) "Act" means National Academy of Legal Studies and Research University (Amendment) Act No. 6 of 2010.
- b) "Courses" means such courses in which limited number of seats are offered by NALSAR which include 5-year B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) Course and LL.M. Course.
- c) "Resident Student" of Telangana³ means:

a student who or any one of his parents has resided in the State of Telangana⁴ for a period of atleast four years; or

- a student who has studied in any one of the educational institutions in the State of Telangana⁵ for a period of not less than four years leading to the qualifying examination.
- S 5.03. A resident student, in order to be eligible for admission to the courses, should have passed the qualifying examination from any educational institution in Telangana⁶ and should also secure appropriate rank in order of merit in the Common Law Admission Test.
- S 5.04. The allocation of seats in the aforementioned courses shall be as follows:

a. Ten seats have been earmarked for admission of Foreign Nationals out of the total of Eighty seats available in 5-year B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) course.

- S 5.08. a. If no candidate is available against the seats reserved for resident students of Telangana¹⁸, such seats shall be added to the relevant categories under All India Quota.
 - The vacant seats of Persons with Disability Category and also the Foreign National Category shall be offered to the All India General Category Candidates only in order of merit.
- S 5.09 In future, if the number of total available seats in aforesaid courses i.e. 5-year B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) and LL.M. in various categories are increased or decreased, as the case may be, the distribution / allocation of seats in different categories shall be altered accordingly or as per Laws and Rules in force at the time.

As the University has to submit information on the intake and the reservations to various categories for the UG and PG Programmes to CLAT Officer during November 30, 2017, with the approval of the Hon'ble Chancellor the following modification were made in Statute – V for providing 5% horizontal reservation for persons with benchmark disabilities:

1) IN S 5.04 (b) SUBSTITUTE THE FOLLOWING

'05% (05 seats) Horizontal reservation shall be applicable for persons with benchmark disabilities'

FOR THE EXISTING

'03% (03 seats) Horizontal reservation shall be applicable for Persons with Diabilities (PWD)'

2) In S 5.04 (d) SUBSTITUTE THE FOLLOWING

'Out of the total seats, 5%, i.e., 03 seats are reserved for persons with benchmark disabilities (Horizontal) and if no candidate is available against the said category, the same will be filled with All India General Category Candidates.

The rule as applicable for the State Quota in other educational institutions in the State should also be made applicable for the State Quota at NALSAR.

Some parents and students are now questioning and claiming that the University should provide reservation for OBC. On the representations received, the National Commission for Backward Classes (NCBC) also called the Vice-Chancellor for personal appearance and accordingly the Vice-Chancellor and Registrar along with the Law Secretary, Telangana State met the Member of NCBC and explained the present rule position of the University. It was further submitted to them that the Commission may make suitable recommendation to the State Government for making necessary modifications in the Act for the implementation of the OBC reservation. However, the Commission directed the University to grant one seat to the petitioner and grant her admission. As the Vice-Chancellor has no power to create a seat or to admit a specific candidate without following the merit and other admission procedure, the candidate was not admitted.

Moreover, this year another clause was inserted in Article 15 of the Constitution which provides for 10% reservation for the Economically Weaker Sections. The amendment is under challenge in the Supreme Court and has been referred to the Constitutional Bench. The State of Telangana has not implemented this new category of reservation. The newly inserted explanation to Article 15 clearly says that Economically Weaker Sections shall be such as may be notified by the State from time to time on the basis of family income and other indicators of economic disadvantage.

2) To admit SC / ST students belonging to Telangana State only under the SC / ST Category

The University has provided 15% seats for All India SC and 7.5% seats for the All India ST category candidates from out of the All India Seats. Further, from out of the 20% seats reserved for the Resident Students of Telangana State, 15% seats are provided for the Resident Students of the Telangana SC candidates and 7.5% are provided for the Resident Students of Telangana ST candidates. Admissions have been made accordingly. Under the All India SC / ST category, candidates belonging to SC / ST from all over the country were admitted based on their merit at CLAT and caste certificate issued by the concerned State Government. During the year 2019 – 2020, one candidate filed a petition before the Hon'ble High Court for the State of Telangana and it was pointed out that under the SC / ST category only SC / ST candidates belonging to the State of Telangana should only be admitted and SC / ST candidates from other States are not entitled for admission under the said categories.

The Hon'ble High Court has to decide the meaning of "migration". In our opinion students who are admitted under All India SC / ST category are not migrants to the State of Telangana as they did not come to the State of Telangana prior to their admission.

3) Further decision has to be taken on providing seats for Foreign Nationals over and above the sanctioned intake

In addition to the aforementioned issues, it is further submitted that the University proposes some modification in the intake and admission process in the Foreign Nationals Category. Clause 4.7 of the UGC (Categorisation of Universities (only) for Grant of Graded Autonomy) Regulations, 2018 lays down that Category – I Universities shall be free to admit foreign students on merit, subject to a maximum of 20% over and above of the strength of their approved domestic students. Universities would be free to fix and charge fees from foreign students without any restriction.

At present University provides 15 seats for foreign nationals (07 for SAARC and 08 for Non-SAARC Candidates) within the sanctioned intake of 120 (105 through CLAT and 15 for Foreign Nationals). In case of LL.M., 10 seats are provided for foreign nationals (05 for SAARC and 05 for Non-SAARC Candidates) within the sanctioned intake of 60 (50 through CLAT and 10 for Foreign Nationals). As the University has now been recognized as Category – I University, it is proposed to provide 20% seats as per the UGC Regulations, i.e., 24 seats in B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) and 12 seats in LL.M. which will be in addition to the sanctioned intake of 120 and 60 respectively. The break up will now be as follows

ITEM NO.11 REGULATIONS FOR THE BBA, MBA INTEGRATED DEGREE PROGRAMME

The Vice-Chancellor informed the members that the National Education Policy-2020 recommends multi-discipline Universities and they should bring Universe of Knowledge to the campus. Accordingly, some institutions have started offering programmes in different areas of specialization. Recently, the Indian Institute of Management, Rohtak has started BBA-LLB course from 2021-2022. NALSAR University of Law already had started MBA Programme through its Department of Management Studies from the year 2013 – 2014 itself. The Vice-Chancellor informed the Council that the Academic Council on the suggestion made by Hon'ble Shri Justice Madan B. Lokur is planning to offer MBA (Court Management) for the Registry of High Courts / District Courts through ODL / Online mode. As per the NEP there should be 'Lateral Entry' and 'Exit' Option to provide flexibility for the students. Considering the aforementioned facts and the recommendations of the Academic Council, the Executive Council approved the proposal of starting of BBA MBA Integrated Degree Programme by the Department of Management Studies from the academic year 2021-2022.

Prof. K. Vidyullatha Reddy suggested distribution of the credits equally among all the semesters. Prof. N. Vasanthi suggested considering JEE Mains score also for the admission.

The Executive Council in principle approved the draft Regulations and directed revision of the curriculum and the eligibility as suggested by the members. The draft Regulations as prepared after incorporating the suggestions made by the members at the meeting are enclosed herewith as **Annexure - I.**

The Council further authorized the Vice-chancellor to make necessary modifications in the draft Regulations, wherever necessary and the same shall be placed before the Councils for ratification. The Council suggested that as far as possible the general rules with regard to grading system, procedure for change of name, Academic Mis-conduct Regulations may be uniformly followed for all the programmes offered by the University.

REGULATIONS FOR 5 year Integrated BBA-MBA DEGREE PROGRAM

1. ELIGIBILITY

- A. The applicants of the Five-year Integrated BBA-MBA program should meet the following eligibility criteria:
 - Candidates who have completed their Class 12th exams from a recognized board with a minimum of 60% aggregate marks (50% for SC/ ST candidates) or equivalent CGPA in Class 12th are eligible to apply; and
 - ii. Valid CLAT/IPMAT(IIM, Indore)/IPMAT(IIM, Rohtak)/JIPMAT(IIM, Jammu & Bodhgaya)/JEE (Mains) score card.

Note: Candidates appearing for their 10+2 or equivalent examination can also apply. Candidates who have applied for CLAT/IPMAT(IIM, Indore)/IPMAT(IIM, Rohtak)/JIPMAT(IIM, Jammu & Bodhgaya)/JEE (Mains) can apply with the proof of the registration for the said tests. They need to submit the score cards immediately after declaration of the merit list of the said examinations.

- B. To be eligible for admission under the Resident Student of Telangana category seats, in addition to complying with the eligibility as mentioned above, candidates must fulfill the following conditions and must secure appropriate rank in order of merit in CLAT/IPMAT(IIM, Indore)/IPMAT(IIM, Rohtak)/JIPMAT(IIM, Jammu & Bodhgaya)/JEE (Mains):
 - i. a person who after studying in the State of Telangana for four consecutive years appears for the qualifying examination in the same State (or)
 - ii. a person who has in the previous seven years resided in the State of Telangana for at least a period of four years, and completed the qualifying examination, i.e., 10+2 or equivalent from the educational institutions in the State of Telangana.

If a Resident Student of Telangana qualifies for admission in the regular All India merit, he / she shall be considered against the All-India Seat only and not against Telangana Quota Seat. If no candidate is available against the Seats reserved for Resident Students of Telangana, such Seats shall be added to the relevant Categories under All India Quota. The vacant seats of Resident Student of Telangana - OBC shall be converted to Resident Students of Telangana General Category and later to All India General Category.

The unfilled Seats reserved for Scheduled Caste candidates are assigned to Scheduled Tribe candidates and vice-versa. If sufficient eligible SC and ST candidates are not available to fill such Seats, they are reallocated to General Category candidates in order of merit.

3. DIRECT ADMISSION UNDER FOREIGN NATIONAL CATEGORY

12 (twelve) seats are allocated to Foreign Nationals for this course out of which 4 (four) seats are for candidates from SAARC Countries and 4 (four) seats for candidates from non-SAARC Countries and 4 (four) seats for ICCR / Government of India nominees. The candidates who possess citizenship of a country other than India shall only be considered under this Category. Foreign Nationals need not take CLAT/IPMAT(IIM, Indore)/IPMAT(IIM, Rohtak)/JIPMAT(IIM, Jammu & Bodhgaya)/JEE (Mains) and should apply directly to NALSAR.

Note: The vacant seats of ICCR / Govt. of India Nominees and the SAARC shall be offered to the candidates from Non-SAARC Countries. If there are vacant seats in the Non-SAARC category, they may be offered to SAARC Countries, if candidates are available. If there are no candidates under SAARC and Non-SAARC category, then the vacant seats may be offered to ICCR/Govt. of India Nominees. If sufficient candidates are not available under Foreign National Category, University may invite applications till the closure of admissions and the seats may be filled as per merit.

4. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

The admissions to the Integrated BBA-MBA Degree Program will be made considering the CLAT/IPMAT(IIM, Indore)/IPMAT(IIM, Rohtak)/JIPMAT(IIM, Jammu & Bodhgaya)/JEE (Mains), Academic credential, and Personal Interview. Admissions will be offered on merit to those who clear any one of the above tests.

50 % weightage will be given for the performance in the aforementioned entrance examinations; 25 % weightage will be given to the performance at 10th and 10 + 2 or equivalent examination together and 25 % weightage will be given for the performance in personal interview for the preparation of the merit list.

The marks obtained in the aforementioned tests will be converted into percentage and based on merit at the test and performance at 10th and 10+2 or equivalent examination, the candidates will be short listed for personal interview. If a candidate appears for more than one test, the candidate may choose to submit the best one as per his/her choice.

- There shall be an increase of Rs.5,000/- p.a. for students from India and SAARC countries and Rs.10,000/- p.a. for students from Non-SAARC countries in the Tuition Fee every academic year for the 5-year integrated B.B.A.M.B.A. Degree Programme.
- Payment towards Mess shall be made separately by the students in advance on yearly basis which comes to approximately Rs. 35,000/- p.a.
- The fees / charges are provisional and subject to revision from time to time as per the decision of university bodies.
