The Vice-Chancellor extended a warm welcome to the members of the Academic Council and thanked the members for taking time and extending their full support to the University by attending the online- meetings. He apprised the members about the UGC Covid- 19 Guidelines of April 29,2020 on the Examinations and Academic Calendar for the Universities. He informed the members that he had constituted three independent Committees with the Faculty members and student representatives to look into the UGC Guidelines and to chart out a plan for the conduct of examinations and evaluation for the present semester and also to suggest the academic calendar for the next session. He further informed the members that the three students who were part of the Committees have also been invited to this emergency meeting as the Special Invitees. He said that for the first time in the history of NALSAR, students are participating in the deliberations of the Academic Council. He then welcomed the students to the meeting of the Academic Council.

The Vice-Chancellor informed the members that the Committees have submitted their reports within the allotted time and the same were circulated amongst the faculty members. The Vice-Chancellor thanked the Faculty Members and the student

representatives of the Committees for their extraordinary efforts in preparing the reports within such short span of time. The Vice-Chancellor after briefly highlighting the main recommendations of the three committees requested the Chairpersons of the Committees to brief the Academic Council about the recommendations made by them.

5-Year B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) Programme

Prof. Amita Dhanda, Chairperson of the Committee informed the members that the Committee after considering several alternative methods in the virtual meetings and after intensive consultations with the students has recommended that the project and mid-semester exam score (which is for 50 marks) of each subject will be retained as it is. She further apprised the members that in case of UG programme, the evaluation of most of the electives has already been completed and for the seminar papers, the submissions and presentations will be taken by the faculty members online. For the remaining 50 marks the up scaling/extrapolation will be done. Hence, the said scheme will be applicable only to the mandatory papers and the electives papers where only 50% evaluation has been completed. She also informed the Council that the UGC guidelines suggested consideration of the previous semester score but the Committee recommended consideration of the overall performance of the students till the last semester if the upscaling of current semester marks adversely affects their CGPA.

After detailed deliberations, the Council approved the report of the Committee for the B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) as given in the agenda.

One Year LL.M. Programme

Prof. K. Vidyullatha Reddy briefed the members about the recommendations made by the Committee. She informed the members that in the LL.M., there is one mandatory paper, elective papers, seminar papers and Dissertation during the current semester. For the mandatory taught paper, it is recommended to conduct an online exam which will be an essay of 2000 words based on the materials provided, by giving the students 48 hours' time. The essay is mainly to test the students on comprehension and learnings made during this semester rather than research or language and expression. 58 out of 60 students have consented to take this kind of examination.

In case of elective papers which are common to the B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) and LL.M. students, the criteria evolved for the B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) students shall be applicable to LL.M. students as well, if they have completed the required course work. For the elective courses, which are offered exclusively to the LL.M. students, it is recommended that the Faculty Members in consultation with the students may decide the pattern of the exam and conduct the online exam which may be take-home exam / essay / assignment etc. Same criteria may be followed in case of the students who

have taken common electives offered to B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) and LL.M. but have not done the course work like B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) students..

For the Seminar Papers, it has been recommended that the presentations may be made to the concerned faculty member instead of panel of faculty members.

Further, the Committee recommended that the evaluation of the dissertations may be done by the internal faculty members and the name of the examiner may also be provided to the student in advance for taking feedback on their proposal and to write dissertation as per the expectations of the examiner. It is further recommended that viva on the dissertation shall be conducted after the evaluation but rather than usual pre-submission presentation.

The Council after detailed deliberations resolved the following:

- The word limit for the Online examination in case of mandatory paper shall be 2500 3000.
- In case of the elective papers, instead of giving complete flexibility to the
 teacher concerned and also to have some sort of uniformity, the Committee
 will have to prepare the guidelines with regard to the exam pattern and the
 mode of the online exam. The Vice-Chancellor requested Prof Amita Dhanda
 to help the committee in evolving these guidelines. The Council authorized the
 Vice-Chancellor to approve the same.
- The Council approved allowing the students to make their seminar presentations to the teacher concerned instead of before the panel of faculty members.
- With regard to the dissertation, it was resolved in the light of the PG Report
 that as far possible internal examiners will be appointed but wherever
 necessary due to the non- availability of internal expertise or otherwise, the
 Vice Chancellor may nominate external examiners.
- The examiner shall confidentially give his feedback on the dissertation proposal, survey of literature, research questions and his expectations etc. to the supervisor and the Supervisor will communicate the same to the student without disclosing the name of the examiner. The Council approved the conduct of viva on the dissertation after the evaluation.
- The schedule provided in the Addenda to the report has been approved and the Council further suggested that the PG Committee may consider grant of extension due to problems faced by the students during the lockdown period.

Two Year MBA Programme

The Vice-Chancellor informed the members that though he is always for the decentralization and does recognize the value of diversity and unique requirements of different courses yet to have some semblance of uniformity, the report of the Committee for the MBA Programme cannot be accepted as holding

examination during lockdown will put MBA students under lot of unnecessary stress.

He further informed the Council that in case of MBA programme, the internal evaluation has been done only for 35 marks (15 marks for individual assessment through quizes and 20 marks for the group assignment).

The Council after detailed discussions with the faculty members of Department of Management and the student representative resolved the following:

- To retain the marks obtained by the students for the 35 marks and for the remaining 65 marks, 65% of the percentage value of the CGPA till the previous trimesters (I & II trimesters in case of first year students and I to V trimesters in case of second year students) shall be taken.
- With regard to the dissertation, the procedure prescribed for the LL.M. programme may be followed for the MBA Programme as well.

The Academic Council authorized the Vice-Chancellor to decide about the commencement of the classes for the next academic session for all the programmes and also to make necessary modifications in the above decisions, while implementing the same if necessary. The Vice-Chancellor informed the Council that in all likelihood at least for the first half of next semester, classes will have to be conducted on-line.

The Vice-Chancellor further informed the members that during the lockdown the University has spent around Rs. 3 Crores on the procurement of e-resources for the library. The students can make best use of these e-resources through remote access for their researches and on-line classes.

The meeting concluded with the vote of thanks to the Chairperson.

- The Library Staff and the Student Representatives had over the last couple of weeks negotiated with the e-resource providers as well as various law houses for further discounts on the resources and books which were approved by the Library Committee in the meeting dated 4th March 2021.
- The Library Committee for eBooks had asked S C Sarkar, Asia Law House, Mohan Law House and Cyber Info Services for quotations.
 - a. Mohan Law House has agreed to give 6.15% discount on OUP eBooks, CUP eBooks, Edward Elgar eBooks and Taylor and Francis eBooks over and above the discounts which had been given by the publishers.
 - b. Cyber Info Services has agreed to give 6.11% discount on OUP eBooks, CUP eBooks, Edward Elgar eBooks and Taylor and Francis eBooks over and above the discounts which had been given by the publishers.
 - c. S C Sarkar had expressed their inability to provide discounts on eBooks.


